
Creation & Worship - Genesis

- The next 6 days are about God forming and filling


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


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
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


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
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
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


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Creation & Worship

- What happens when we worship?
- Worship means loving God, giving God our whole self; there is only thing we can give God that he doesn't have – yourself (because He will not force himself on you)
- Creation exists for a space where God and man give themselves to each other

Creation & Worship

- Fall:
- Man refuses to make a gift of himself back to God
- Love is seen as dependence and is rejected
- Worship after the Fall:
- Worship now includes atonement (reconciliation), repairing the damage that sin has done - purification/healing, and painful expiation – the instrument by which God will teach us how to give ourselves back to Him, to love Him
- Worship takes the form of sacrifice

Worship in the Old Testament

- God wants to free His people from Egypt
- So they can worship
- Exodus 8:23 "We must go a three days' journey in the wilderness and sacrifice to the LORD, our God, as he commands us."
- God calls his people to be a "a kingdom of priests, a holy nation" (Ex 19:6)
- Israel is to be qadosh, "holy", "set apart" for worship

- Exodus 19:1 In the third month after the Israelites' departure from the land of Egypt, on the first day, they came to the wilderness of Sinai
- Exodus 19:10-11 the LORD said to Moses: Go to the people and have them sanctify themselves today and tomorrow. Have them wash their garments and be ready for the third day; for on the third day the LORD will come down on Mount Sinai in the sight of all the people


 Exodus 19:14-15 - Then Moses came down from the mountain to the people and had them sanctify themselves, and they washed their garments. He said to the people, "Be ready for the third day. Do not approach a woman."

- Exodus 19:16 On the morning of the third day there were peals of thunder and lightning, and a heavy cloud over the mountain, and a very loud blast of the shofar, so that all the people in the camp trembled.
- Exodus 19:18 Now Mount Sinai was completely enveloped in smoke, because the LORD had come down upon it in fire. The smoke rose from it as though from a kiln, and the whole mountain trembled violently.

 Exodus 24:1.4-11 - Moses himself was told: Come up to the LORD, you and Aaron, with Nadab, Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel...Moses then wrote down all the words of the LORD and, rising early in the morning, he built at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve sacred stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then, having sent young men of the Israelites to offer burnt offerings and sacrifice young bulls as communion offerings to the LORD, Moses took half of the blood and put it in large bowls; the other half he splashed on the altar. Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, "All that the LORD has said, we will hear and do." Then he took the blood and splashed it on the people, saying, "This is the blood of the covenant which the LORD has made with you according to all these words." Moses then went up with Aaron, Nadab, Abihu, and seventy elders of Israel, and they beheld the God of Israel. Under his feet there appeared to be sapphire tilework, as clear as the sky itself. Yet he did not lay a hand on these chosen Israelites. They saw God, and they ate and drank.


Tabernacle of Moses

 According to all that I show you regarding the pattern of the tabernacle and the pattern of its furnishings, so you are to make it
- Exodus 25-40 describe in detail exactly how the tabernacle is to be built and then how Moses builds it, following the rules




Tabernacle Complex





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SOLOMON'S TEMPLE





Dedication of Temple


- 2 Chron 6:1-2 Then Solomon said: "The LORD intends to dwell in the dark cloud; I have built you a princely house, the base for your enthronement forever."
- 2 Chron 6:13 Solomon had made a bronze platform five cubits long, five cubits wide, and three cubits high, which he had placed in the middle of the courtyard. Having ascended it, Solomon knelt in the presence of the whole assembly of Israel and stretched forth his hands toward heaven
- 2 Chron 7:1 When Solomon had ended his prayer, fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offerings and the sacrifices, and the glory of the LORD filled the house.


Dedication of Temple

- 2 Chron 7:3-4 All the Israelites looked on while the fire came down and the glory of the LORD was upon the house, and they fell down upon the pavement with their faces to the earth and worshiped, praising the LORD, "who is so good, whose love endures forever." The king and all the people offered sacrifices before the LORD
- 2 Chron 7:6 The priests were standing at their stations, as were the Levites, with the musical instruments of the LORD which King David had made to give thanks to the LORD, "whose love endures forever," when David offered praise through them. The priests opposite them blew the trumpets and all Israel stood

Herod's Temple on the Temple Mount

King Herod the Great began renovations on the Temple in approximately 20–19 BC. The entire temple expansion, including the massive Temple Mount, was not complete until approximately AD 62–64, only to be destroyed by the Romans in AD 70.

 Eph 3:8-10 - To me, the very least of all the holy ones, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the inscrutable riches of Christ, and to bring to light [for all] what is the plan of the mystery hidden from ages past in God who created all things, so that the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known through the church to the principalities and authorities in the heavens.
